LMHBC Summer Round-Up

From Rowing to Coaching

Over the summer, Rosie and Amber, introduced students attending the Oxford Summer School at Oriel to rowing.

They delivered a structured programme of ergo and water sessions to the 14-18 year olds. Across the programme, Rosie and Amber watched their students grow in confidence and team work, seeing major improvements from students who had never even stepped foot in a boat before.

Rosie and Amber's coaching sparked a genuine enthusiasm for rowing amongst the Summer School students. This enthusiasm culminated in an intense 500m erg sprint competition, providing excitement for all involved. A particular highlight was the informal bumps race which offered the Summer School students an insight into what college rowing at the University of Oxford is like.

We are looking forward to see Amber and Rosie using their new-found coaching techniques to train up our novices this Michaelmas!

Sudbury International Regatta

In August, two LMHBC rowers, Charlie and Lucy competed at Subdury 'International' Regatta representing their home clubs, Sudbury and Gravesend.

Training at Sudbury over the summer, this little boat club on the Stour proved the perfect place to make the most of warm, sleepy evenings, with few other river users and plenty of boats to choose from. Once the tight corners and narrow spinning areas were mastered, it became an ideal stretch for long, steady miles in the sun.

The regatta itself, though small, drew crews from across the Thames to the Cam — even one from New Zealand — to race the short 850 m course and the thrilling 300 m eights sprint. The river's tight mid-course bend, barely wide enough for two boats, tested both steering and nerve, and has made more than a few training outings in a single a bit wet!

Despite its size, Sudbury delivered close, lively racing — with weeds, swans, and plenty of excitement along the way. Racing for Sudbury, our training mostly involved seeing how high we could rate before things fell apart. Holding around 40 strokes per minute was a shock to the system but made for fast, chaotic, and exhilarating racing on the narrow Stour.

On Friday 10th October, we invited freshers to Boat Club Drinks, which proved to once again be a huge success.



To finish off a successful week of recruitment, we opened up our Boathouse to all the keen newcomers who had signed up for Taster Outings - which were filled up almost immediately!


